What does the studentship include?

The studentship is open for home and overseas applicants on a full-time basis only and includes:

- Full home/EU rate* tuition fees for 3 years
- ◆ Annual stipend of £14,553 (increases annually in line with ESRC rates)
- £3,000 per annum student travel allowance
- £1,500 per annum conference allowance
- £1,750 per annum project consumables allowance

The award of a studentship will be based on a competitive selection process and its renewal for each subsequent year over the three-year course of study will be strictly subject to satisfactory progress.

* Overseas applicants are welcome to apply, but will be required to pay the difference between the home/EU rate and the overseas rate.
